We know that reporting safeguarding concerns can feel difficult

When someone shares a concern, it is important they are listened to and taken seriously. You are not expected to investigate. Keeping people safe and ensuring concerns are recorded and referred appropriately is one of our responsibilities.



Recognise
Be alert to signs or disclosures of abuse.



Respond
Listen carefully and take what is being said seriously.



Record
Make a written record of what has been shared.



Refer
Share the concern with the Safeguarding Officer and relevant authorities.
